




Five-Year Graduation Rate at Ardsley High School

Class of 2023: 166 AHS Graduates




% OF AHS STUDENTS ATTENDING MOST COMPETITIVE AND HIGHLY SELECTIVE





College Board has added new metrics to their score reports for educators:


- 1. College Culture: 63% of students took at least 1 AP while at AHS.

- 4. AP Access Award: The College Board recognizes AHS as providing all students a chance to participate in an AP course, including underrepresented populations.










Global History Regents New Framework: Performance Level Information




